- **Mount Airy City Schools plan to start on August 17th and the Millennium Charter Academy on August, 19th. Surry County Schools will start school virtually for the first six weeks.**
- **Schools will open for in-person instruction under an updated Plan B that requires face coverings for all K-12 students, fewer children in the classroom, measures to ensure social distancing for everyone in the building, and other safety protocols.**
- **As restaurants and businesses continue to open, COVID-19 remains a threat. Know your 3 W's and make a difference locally.**
