Street Light Policy

Chapter 13: Streets and Sidewalks, the Mount Airy Code of Ordinances

Article I. In General, Section 13-8.

Street Light Standards and Specifications. Street lights shall be installed along all city streets according to city standards and along state maintained streets according to NCDOT standards. Lights shall be a minimum of 27,500 lumens along major thoroughfares, 9,500 lumens along collector streets, and 7,500 lumens along local streets.

a) A light shall be located at street intersections. Blocks longer than 400 feet shall be divided as evenly as possible. In no case shall lights be closer than 250 feet or further than 400 feet from one another.

b) Lights shall be located within public street rights-of-way. Requests for lights due to safety concerns or outside of this policy shall be made to the Board of Commissioners.

Section 5. Copies of this capital project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, and to the Budget Officer and to the Finance Officer for direction in establishing the Ararat River Outfall Extension Project fund and carrying out this project.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the City of Mount Airy adopted the 1992-93 fiscal year budget on June 18, 1992;

AND WHEREAS the Water and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund requires adjustments to authorize an appropriation of funds for the Ararat River Outfall Extension Project;

AND WHEREAS General Statute 159-15 of the North Carolina Government Fiscal Control Act provides authority to amend a current municipal budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that authorization is hereby given to make the following adjustments:

Section 11. Water and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund Expenditures

Increase Transfer to Ararat River Outfall Extension Project Fund by
\$137,000 from \$0 to \$137,000;

Section 12. Water and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund Revenues

Increase Fund Balance Appropriation by \$137,000 from \$2,971,748 to
\$3,108,748.

STATE FUNDING FOR COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS: On motion by Commissioner Browne seconded by Commissioner King a resolution was adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS in North Carolina the Lead Regional Organizations, as voluntary organizations serving municipal and county governments, have established productive working relationships with the cities and counties across the state; and

WHEREAS the 1992 General Assembly recognized this need through the appropriation of \$864,270 to help the Lead Regional Organizations assist local governments with grant applications, economic development, community development, and to support local industrial development activities and other activities as deemed appropriate by their local governments; and

WHEREAS these funds are not intended to be used for payment of member dues or assessments to a Lead Regional Organization or to supplant funds appropriated by the member governments; and

WHEREAS in the event that a request is not made by the City of Mount Airy for release of these funds to our regional council, the available funds will revert to State's general funds; and

WHEREAS in Region I, funds in the amount of \$48,015 will be used to provide grantwriting and technical assistance to member governments for community and economic development to disseminate economic, demographic and mapping information on the Region to member governments, media, business, developers, human service providers and the general public; to purchase computer hardware and software for graphic information systems; and to supplement funding for the Northwest Piedmont Development Corporation which is certified by the Small Business Administration to package loans for small businesses in the region;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mount Airy Board of Commissioners requests the release of its share of these funds, \$1,072.98, to the Northwest Piedmont Council of Governments at the earliest possible time in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 900, House Bill 1340, section 180 of the 1992 Session Laws.

ORDER OF COLLECTION OF TAX LEVY: On motion by Commissioner Lowry seconded by Commissioner Bowman, Carolyn Hegler was authorized and empowered to collect the 1992-1993 tax levy by all legal means.

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AUTHORIZATION FOR CONTRACT ON PHASE II LOVILLS CREEK CHANNELIZATION: On motion by Commissioner King seconded by Commissioner Taylor the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS bids were received on August 13, 1992 and advertised and received on August 27, 1992 for the Lovills Creek Channel Project Phase II;

AND WHEREAS bids were received from the following firms:

Herve Cody Construction	\$ 792,013.70
Landform Construction, Inc.	844,690.00
Boggs/Vaughn Contracting, Inc.	854,664.00
HMG, Inc.	981,185.50

AND WHEREAS City staff and the Project Administrator, after review, recommend award of the contract to the low bidder, subject to the approval and concurrence of the US Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mount Airy approves award of the Lovills Creek Channel Project Phase II to the low bidder, Herve Cody Construction Company, in the amount of \$792,013.70.

BUDGET AMENDMENT--MUNICIPAL SERVICE DISTRICT: On motion by Commissioner Browne seconded by Commissioner Lowry a resolution was adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the City of Mount Airy adopted the 1992-1993 budget on June 18, 1992;

AND WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners desires to allocate an additional amount to the Municipal Service District that is needed to complete the paving of the alleyways behind Davis Rooms and Owens Jewelry;

AND WHEREAS General Statute 159-15 of the North Carolina Government Fiscal Control Act provides authority to amend a current municipal budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that authorization is hereby given to make the following adjustments:

Section 7: Municipal Service District Expenditures

Increase Municipal Service District by \$2,000 from \$38,500 to \$40,500;

Decrease Increase in Reserves by \$2,000 from \$10,500 to \$8,500.

DUKE POWER OFFER TO PURCHASE: On motion by Commissioner Bowman seconded by Commissioner Lowry the Board accepted an offer from Duke Power Company to purchase a small parcel of land on Rockford Street for \$250, subject to the upset bid process.

No further business, the meeting adjourned on motion by Commissioner Browne seconded by Commissioner Lowry.
