

****ATTENTION: Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 166A-19.30(a)(2) in accordance with Governor Cooper’s Executive Order No. 204, face coverings over your mouth and nose are required to enter the building and/or attend City of Mount Airy Board Meetings. "Face Covering-means a covering of the nose and mouth that is secured to the head with ties, straps, or loops over the ears or is simply wrapped around the lower face. A Face Covering can be made of a variety of synthetic and natural fabrics, including cotton, silk, or linen. Ideally, a Face Covering has two (2) or more layers. A Face Covering may be factory-made, sewn by hand, or can be improvised from household items such as scarfs, bandanas, t-shirts, sweatshirts, or towels. Based on recommendations from the CDC, face shields do not meet the requirements for Face Coverings."
